Under federal and state laws, people with disabilities are a "protected class" in the workplace.

Title I of the AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES

ACT states that "No covered entity [employer] shall discriminate against a qualified person with a disability because of the disability of such individual in regard to job application procedures; the hiring, advancement, or discharge of employees; employee compensation; job training; and other terms, conditions and privileges of employment."

The U.S. Supreme Court has ruled that persons cannot sue state employers for money damages based on claims of disability discrimination. For these persons, our Center can assist with the filing of an EEOC complaint to stop future disability-based discrimination.

The federal **REHABILITATION ACT** provides funding for individual vocational rehabilitation for people with disabilities, to improve their ability and opportunity to obtain gainful employment.

The federal TICKET TO WORK & WORK INCENTIVES IMPROVEMENT ACT provides incentives for SSI and SSDI recipients to return to work.
